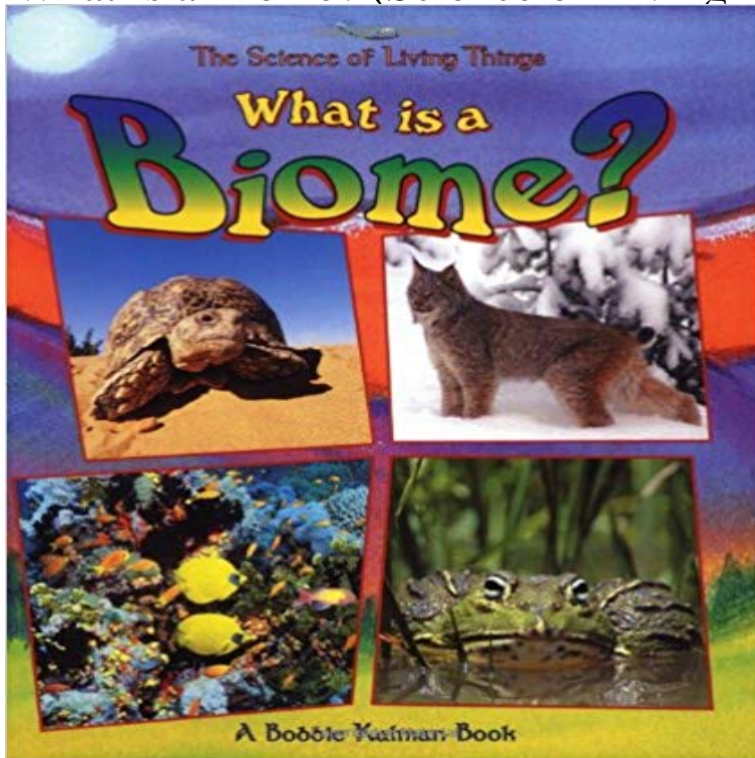


What Is a Biome? (Science of Living Things (Paperback))
