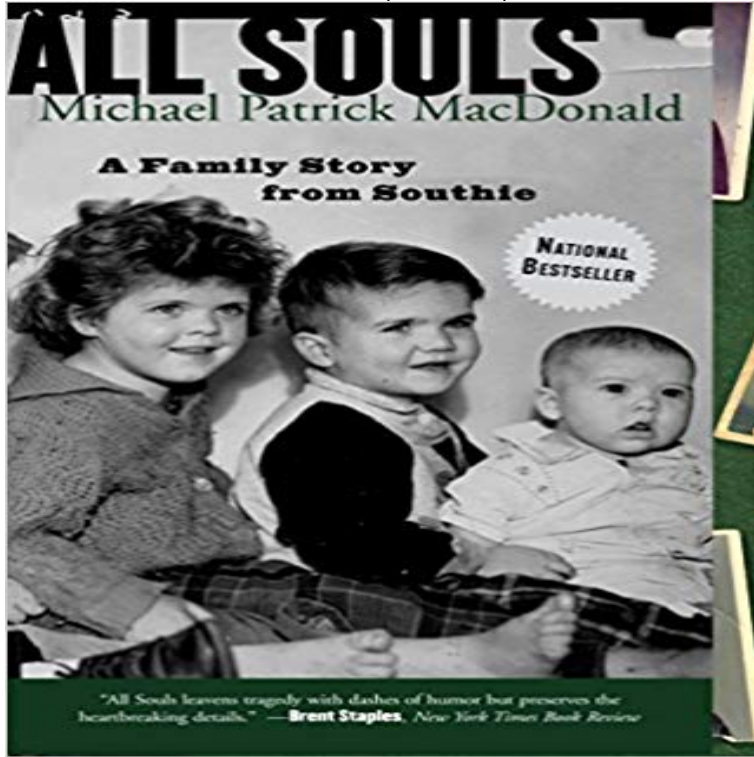


## All Souls: A Family Story from Southie
