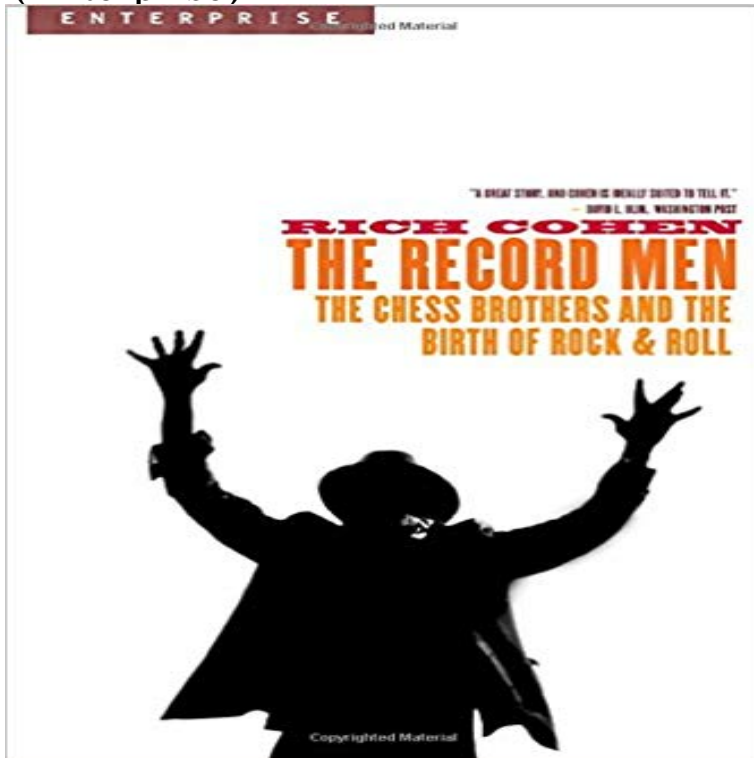


The Record Men: The Chess Brothers and the Birth of Rock & Roll (Enterprise)
